Newly enrolling students will not be permitted to begin school in FCPS unless they provide documentation of receiving **at least one dose** of each of the immunizations below:

Immunization	Required Number of Doses
<b>Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis</b> (DTaP/ DT/DPT/Td)	3 - 4 doses
<b>Hepatitis A</b> (Hep A/HAV) Required for kindergarten starting in 2021-22 and later: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In <b>2022-23</b>, required for grades <b>K and 1 only</b></li> <li>• In <b>2023-24</b>, required for grades <b>K, 1, and 2 only</b></li> </ul>	2 doses
<b>Hepatitis B</b> (Hep B/HBV)	3 doses
<b>Measles/Mumps/Rubella</b> (MMR)	2 doses
<b>Polio</b> (IPV/OPV)	3 - 4 doses
<b>Varicella</b> (Chickenpox)	2 doses
